ACCIDENTAL 911 CALLS - WHAT CAN I DO?

We've all misdialed phone numbers. If you accidentally dial 911, or if a child in your home dials 911 when no emergency exists, **do not hang up**. Stay on the line and explain 911 was called by mistake. If you do hang up, you can expect a call back, because we need to verify whether there is an emergency and ensure you are safe. If you don't answer the call back, emergency resources will be dispatched to your location to assess the situation.

Will 911 charge me if I accidentally call them?

No! Everyone makes mistakes, and there is no penalty for accidentally dialing 911. The operator may verify your name and location to ensure your safety. Don't worry, accidental 911 calls happen.



Inactive Phones

If you have an unused wireless phone used by kids as a toy or gaming, it may still have the ability to dial 911. Even if the phone is no longer on an active plan, if it is charged, it can still call 911. Ensure children know how to call 911 in an emergency, and how to appropriately react if they dial 911 in error.

Wireless phones and wearables emergency SOS features

Both Android and iOS-based phones feature enhanced emergency SOS features that have the potential to initiate automated 911 calls.

When activated, an audible alarm may be heard along with a countdown timer allowing the user to cancel within a few seconds.

Device settings can be adjusted or often defeated depending on the device make/model. Here's how:

iOS

1. Open Settings.
2. Select "Emergency SOS".
3. Adjust settings as desired.



Android

1. Select the app drawer and choose Safety App.
2. Select "Features".
3. Select "Car Crash Detection".
4. Adjust settings as desired.



Amusement park rides, skiing, or activities with intense movement can initiate an accidental 911 call from your smartphone/wearable device.

Place your device in a safe location or enter airplane mode to prevent accidental activation.
